The White House

The first president of the US, George Washington, selected the site for the White House in 1791. The architect to build it was James Hoban who, after eight years of construction, finished the residence for the second President, John Adams, and his wife, Abigail. During the war of 1812, the British set fire to the House and Hoban rebuilt it, adding a north portico which now is the most important symbol of the front side.

In 1901, President Theodore Roosevelt officially gave the White House its current name. In 1902 he began a major renovation including the relocation of the president's offices from the second floor to the newly constructed temporary Executive Office Building (known as the West Wing). His successor, President William Howard Taft, had the Oval Office constructed within and enlarged the office wing. Less than 50 years later, the White House was showing signs of serious structural weakness. President Harry S. Truman began a renovation in which everything but the outer walls were dismantled.

Since then, every president has occupied the White House and the history of this building extends far beyond the construction of its walls. It is both the home of the President of the United States and his family, and a museum of American history. With 132 rooms, 35 bathrooms, 28 fireplaces and 3 elevators, countless leaders and dignitaries have been entertained and taken care of there. The White House is a place where history continues to unfold.
